# An inclusive & meaningful *lifestyle program*

Designing our Lifestyle Program takes careful consideration, creative thinking and lots of input from residents.

Each month, our Lifestyle Team plans a wide range of activities and outings to cater for different interests, and also different abilities or conditions, including dementia.

Residents with advanced dementia and high-level care needs are encouraged to participate in the program as much as they like. All activities are modified to be dementia-appropriate, following best-practice research. Some of these modifications include using simple visual and verbal cues, keeping noise to a minimum, and using personal items to spark reminiscing.

One activity that's very popular is the Painting Group where residents, including some from our dementia support household, gather to follow team leader, Michelle, paint a canvas. Art therapy is known to provide people living with dementia with enjoyment, a sense of accomplishment, and an opportunity for self-expression.

This is certainly the case for Mary who becomes so absorbed in painting, she finds it hard to stop! "It's wonderful to see how much joy painting gives to Mary," said Michelle. 'She attends every session and I often have to remind her when it's lunch time as she just wants to keep going. Her paintings are so detailed and she proudly displays them all in her room. I love that we can facilitate this interest for her."



Vincent Court is one of the first aged care communities on the Mid North Coast to introduce CareKeeper, a cutting-edge mobile technology that enhances the delivery of care to residents.

The innovation, developed by Telstra Health, allows every Nurse and Carer to access important information about each resident's care needs, including clinical information and lifestyle choices and preferences, on a mobile device in real time. Staff are able to quickly view, action and record care information or tasks while being at the resident's side.

Each resident's individual preferences, such as choice of daily routine or favourite activities, are also accessible giving staff more opportunities to engage meaningfully with residents to provide a truly holistic care experience. Staff are excited about the rollout of the technology saying it reduces paperwork and time spent at nurse's stations.

CareKeeper is part of Apollo Care's overall strategy to ensure every care worker is equipped with a mobile device that delivers wider benefits including faster response times to resident calls and enhanced team collaboration.

#### Vincent Court is *ticking all the boxes*

When the Australian Government's Aged Care Quality Assessors independently audited Vincent Court late last year, our community achieved the maximum possible accreditation of three years. Vincent Court was found to meet or exceed all eight Aged Care Quality Standards.



To mark this outstanding result, Apollo Care's CEO, Stephen Becsi OAM visited our community last month to present Manager, Kylie Bonney and Carer, Hope Bellenger the Certificate of Accreditation.
